PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

Wollongong Art Gallery Friends Resident Artist program is an exciting opportunity for Artists of the Illawarra area. It provides a centrally located studio work space plus a nominal stipend. The successful applicant will be required to contribute to the Gallery's public programs, which will be negotiated with the Gallery for the successful applicant.

All applicants must develop and submit a detailed proposal including:

- a short biography or curriculum vitae, and contact address, phone number and email.
- a description of your past and present art practice or interests.
- an exhibition proposal / outline simply explaining:
your ideas, purpose or concept, why you would like to be Resident Artist at Wollongong Art Gallery, the potential benefits or relevance your work would have to the local community and the wider community.
- intended use of the studio space and proposed outcomes.
- the nature of your art practice.
- potential costs and how you expect to cover them.
- approx. 5 - 10 images or video of your work. These must be clear and detailed examples of your work.
